LEXINGTON CATHOLIC HIGH SCHOOL PROFILE 2006-2007

INTRODUCTION AND ACCREDITATION

Founded in 1951, Lexington Catholic was born through the merger of two older secondary schools, St. Catherine's Academy and Lexington Latin School. This school serves the Roman Catholic Diocese of Lexington by providing quality college preparatory education for local Catholic students, as well as students of other faith traditions. The academic program includes an emphasis on spiritual ideals and embodies a commitment to the holistic development of the mind, spirit, and body of each student. Students come from virtually all neighborhoods in the greater Lexington area, as well as from several adjacent counties in central Kentucky. Lexington Catholic has 53 full-time teachers, 8 part-time teachers, 4 full-time guidance counselors, one full-time librarian, one full-time library assistant, one full-time school chaplain, and one full-time campus minister. Average class size is 22 students.

Current student population is 874; the senior class numbers 204.

RANK IN CLASS/G.P.A.

All Lexington Catholic High School students are ranked based on semester grades. The rank is weighted, and the following formula is used in the computation of rank: Advanced Placement courses are weighted 1.10 (designated by "AP" on the transcript and grade reports). Honors courses are weighted 1.05 (designated by "H" on the transcript and grade reports). G.P.A. is also reported on a 100 point scale. The highest current weighted G.P.A. in the Senior Class is 101.02. The median grade for the Senior Class after 6 semesters is 90.62. Rank and composite G.P.A. are included on senior transcripts.

GRADE SCALE - A: 100-93, B: 92-85, C: 84-78, D: 77-70, F: BELOW 70.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS/HONOR ROLL

Students are required to take a minimum of six courses each semester, and they must have at least twenty-four credits to graduate. Classes meet five times per week for forty-five minute periods. The following distribution of courses is a minimum requirement for graduation:
