

Faculty Committees Lexington Catholic High School

Every full-time faculty member will serve on a faculty committee. The committees are to serve as professional learning communities (Du Four et al.) and work to address goals of the school and to improve student learning. All meetings will be within the Monday rotation of meetings or on professional development days. Every committee should keep minutes following the format in the summer faculty reading assignments on professional learning communities.

Each committee should develop a roles and goals statement at the first meeting. The following statements are to provide a draft which may be amended by the committee.

Technology Committee: The committee has the responsibility for creating and maintaining a three to five year technology plan which focuses on instructional technology. For this year, the committee has the responsibility of overseeing the achievement of the school's goal on the yearly plan:

Management and Planning:

Goal: The school will utilize technology to better communicate with students and parents.

The committee should plan and monitor for the achievement of the three objectives written to achieve this goal.

Campus Ministry: The committee has the responsibility for sustaining the Catholic Identity of the school. For this year, the committee has the responsibility of overseeing the achievement of the schools goal on the yearly plan:

Catholic Identity

Goal: The students and staff are actively involved in ministry programs.

The committee should plan and monitor for the achievement of the three objectives written to achieve this goal.

School Performance: The committee has the responsibility for reviewing and analyzing data to measure the school's overall performance. The committee will use data from standardized tests, school semester exams, teacher performance assessments, and student surveys to measure the performance of the school. The committee will assume additional duties in those years in which the school prepares for accreditation visits. For this year, the committee has the responsibility for overseeing the achievement of the school's goal on the yearly plan:

Curriculum/Instructional Improvement

Goal: The faculty will work to develop an aligned curriculum.

Working closely with academic departments, the committee should plan and monitor for the achievement of the four objectives written to achieve this goal.

Integrity: The committee has the responsibility for creating and monitoring a culture of integrity within the school community. For this year, the committee has the responsibility of overseeing the achievement of the school's goal on the yearly plan:

Student Development

Goal: The school will promote integrity within the entire school community.

The committee should plan and monitor for the achievement of the three objectives written to achieve this goal.

Learning Differences: The committee has the responsibility of working across departments to design options for programs to serve all students most effectively within the school. For this year, the committee has the responsibility of overseeing the achievement of the school's goal on the yearly plan:

Curriculum/Instructional Improvement:

Goal: The faculty will study the feasibility of meeting the needs of diverse learners.

The committee should plan and monitor for the achievement of the two goals written to achieve this goal.

Honors: The committee has the responsibility for seeking ways to recognize student achievement both within the school and in the community at large. The committee serves as a review board for selecting candidates for honor societies and selecting award recipients for academic awards. The committee is also charged with seeking ways to involve LCHS students in contests and competitions.
